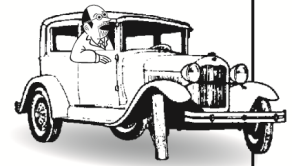
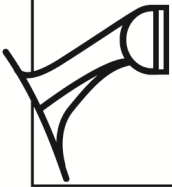

ball bearings and slides. For the containers, I use the same thing that my dad did – used plastic quart oil jugs, with the tops cut off. Think of how many of these things you go through in a year. They are cheap, readily available, and durable.

How durable? They survive anything. You can drop them on a frosty day, and they will not break or chip. I've even driven over them, and been able to pop them back into shape.

One drawer contains all of the nuts, sorted by size. Another drawer has all the bolts, sorted by diameter and length. You open a drawer, it is like being at a hardware store, everything is laid out in front of you.

There are also drawers for electrical and plumbing. Just imagine how nice it is working on a project, and being to see if you have all the supplies that you need.

Each drawer holds around 1.82 cubic feet. There are 5 drawers per unit, for a total of 9.14 cubic feet of storage. The total cubic square feet, of all 7 units and 35 drawers is just under 64 cubic feet.

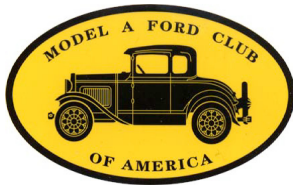
